BRANCH MEETING AND POTLUCK BRUNCH February 13, 2016 - 10 A.M. Conley Hall, Trott Building, Asbury Village "Wellness Genetics" Presented By: Fredric Abramson, Ph.D.

Join the brunch at Conley Hall on February 13 from 10 a.m. to noon. Bring a dish to share and enjoy the wonderful choice of dishes of others. We are featuring a presentation by Fredric Abramson, Ph.D., S.M., Esq., on "Wellness Genetics." Dr. Abramson will share with us a system and method for evaluating and providing nutrigenomic data, information, and science. This concept encompasses the use of our genetic assets to deliver new solutions for personal growth and smarter parenting, and for achieving important lifelong goals. He will also describe how matching ingredients might lower disease risk.

Dr. Abramson is an attorney specializing in business and technology law. He is also the president, CEO, and founder of AlphaGenics, Digital Nutrition, LLC, and the nonprofit organization, Fresh Start Science. Dr. Abramson served as adjunct professor with the Johns Hopkins University biotechnology master's program. His business background includes entertainment, health care, information technology, managerial finance, marketing, retail sales management, computer software design, copyright and trademark law, strategic planning, organizational development, health policy, and teaching.

GAITHERSBURG BRANCH GIVES MORE SCHOLARSHIP MONEY

At its January meeting AAUW Gaithersburg approved the final allocation of scholarship and grant money for the past year. These current donations are designated for AAUW scholarships and grants that have an impact nationally.

To help combat sex discrimination in higher education and in the workplace, we are giving \$1,000 to the Legal Advocacy Fund. Then, focusing on the need to help women who need to further their education, such as completing their dissertation or planning research, we are giving \$1,000 to the American Fellowships Fund. Following in this line of helping women already in the educational system but now needing to advance or change their careers, we are contributing \$2,000 for Career Development Grants. Recognizing the need to shift career choices from traditional lowpaying "women's jobs" to more substantial and diversified careers, we are allocating \$2,500 to the Selected Professions Fellowships which concentrates on master's programs in architecture,

computer sciences, engineering, and math.

These current donations follow those that were approved at the June 2015 annual meeting and that were designated for the benefit of local students: \$10,000 to students at Montgomery College and the Universities at Shady Grove and \$1,500 for students to attend the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders at the University of Maryland.

Adding it up, these scholarships and grants come to \$18,000 earned in book sales by hardworking Branch members in 2015. As a national AAUW member, you may be proud that, with national AAUW providing over \$3.7 million for scholarships and grants this past fiscal year, you are part of one the world's largest sources of funding for graduate women.

At our February 3 and March 2 HerStory meetings we will continue our discussion of the First Ladies who approached and experienced the Civil War and its aftermath. In February we cover Margaret Taylor, Abigail Fillmore, Jane Pierce, and Harriet Lane (John Buchanan's niece); perhaps we will also get to Mary Todd Lincoln.

The commonality of experiencing the war and its aftermath will also characterize the women we discuss in our March meeting. Certainly the war affected the daily lives of Eliza Johnson and Julia Grant when they were First Ladies. Theirs were the tumultuous years of reconstituting the Union during the Reconstruction Era. The city of Washington by 1865 was vastly different from the pre-war city, divided as it was by abolition and westward expansion. Coming to

know these women and how they coped with the new world will fill the March 2 afternoon with lively discussion.

Please note: As has been the case, the HerStory Group meets in the Club Room at Park View (building 211) at Asbury. But for the March 2 meeting we will make an exception and meet in Apartment 1, which is on the terrace level (lobby level).
