AGNES

Commemorating the 45th Anniversary of Our Founding

There it was, this old box, sitting there and, curiously, someone had scrawled "Agnes" on it. So, it was opened. Inside were old records--the founding papers of our Gaithersburg Branch! But why "Agnes?" Here is the story.

The Gaithersburg Gazette carried this notice: "Local AAUW to be formed....Women college graduates are invited to attend an organizational and get-acquainted meeting of the Gaithersburg Branch of AAUW on Wednesday, June 21, 1972, at 8 p.m. at the Gaithersburg High School."

Then Hurricane Agnes came, the costliest hurricane to hit the U.S. up to that time in recorded history. Perhaps the Gaithersburg women continued their work for a while despite the storm. Perhaps they then frantically stashed their papers in the box, hurriedly scrawled "Agnes" on it in homage, and scampered home to seek shelter.

In any case, after the turmoil, on July 12, a second meeting was held at the high school. Then on Septem-

ber 27, 1972, at 8 p.m. at Governors Square Community Room on Muddy Branch Road, AAUW Gaithersburg Branch was officially chartered. Mary Schlager, who had initiated the founding meetings, was elected the first president. Among the founding members who are still members of



the Branch were Anna Fraker, Susan Schlager Geiger and Mina Parsont.

We were born in the indignant rage of a hurricane but (to paraphrase) "nevertheless we persisted" in fighting for equity.

We are the daughters of Agnes.
