Presidents Message

The September 18 anniversary celebration was an enormous success. We had a chance to visit with people we had not seen in a long time and enjoy informative and stimulating presentations. This newsletter contains a few photos from the event.

But there is another branch celebration —On Saturday, October 15, Gaithersburg branch will host AAUW members from throughout the state at the AAUW-Maryland Fall conference at the Casey Community Center. You can register for the event using the form in this newsletter or download the form at the branch website, https://gaithersburg-md.aauw.net/. Submit it quickly to take advantage of the early-bird registration rate.

If you have a little time to help with meeting logistics, setting up tables and chairs, or picking up breakfast and lunch items, please contact me (edieallison[at]gmail[dot]com.)

The morning program at the state meeting will focus on *Improving Voter Participation for Younger Citizens*. The keynote speaker will be Karla Silvestre, Director of Community Engagement at Montgomery College and Vice President of the County Board of Education, among other community leadership positions. Ms. Silvestre will discuss ways to engage younger voters as well as provide information on the success of allowing 16-year-olds to vote in local elections. This is an international effort to engage younger voters and set them up as consistent participants in civic life.

Tenth grade social studies in Montgomery County focuses on National, state, and local government, and includes a unit on participation in the political process.

The Maryland League of Women Voters twoyear study of civic education in Maryland gave the state high marks but thought that some SSL requirements could be better focused to enhance students' civic education.

Although the popular media may suggest that young people have disconnected from political affairs, I have seen many enthusiastic young voters and election workers, as well as under-18 election aides at the polls. One program to encourage young citizen participation in the election process that I have observed as an election worker is Student Election Aides: sixth through twelfth grade students, who are trained and employed by Montgomery County Board of Elections' "Future Vote" program. The students earn SSL, student service learning, credits for helping set up and take down equipment, greeting voters, and surveying voters about their election experience as they leave the polling place. These young people may have offered you an "I Voted" sticker as you left the voting place.

Be sure to check on your voter registration: are you registered? Have you changed your address on the voting records if you have moved? Are you signed up for a mail-in ballot if you want one? Remember the midterm election is on November 8, and early voting runs from October 27 through November 3.

AAUW Gaithersburg is celebrating its 50th anniversary and looks forward to welcoming AAUW members from around the state. The venue is the Casey Community Center, 810 South Frederick Avenue (MD 355, also known as Rockville Pike along parts of its length), Gaithersburg, MD 20877. It is a Gaithersburg city landmark that you will recognize as a repurposed and renovated stone barn built in 1938.

Directions:

The Casey Community Center is located on the west side of MD 355. If coming north on MD 355 you will need to make a U-turn to enter the center driveway. Parking is free and located behind the barn. Signs will direct you to the entrance on the north side of the building.

Registration cost per participant: \$35 if reserved by October 5, \$40 if reserved after October 5, or \$15 if participating remotely via Zoom. Fee includes morning coffee, refreshments, and lunch.

All attendees are required to be vaccinated. Masking will follow the local requirements at the time, although masks may be worn at any time.

EXCERPS FROM GAITHERSBURG BRANCH HISTORY

Since 1987, earnings from Gaithersburg AAUW's annual used Book Sale funded advancement in higher education for women and girls. Since 2003, the sale funded \$131,289 in scholarships for local girls attending Montgomery College or the Universities at Shady Grove; and \$94,200 in graduate fellowships through AAUW-US Education Fund. An additional \$14,800 was donated to AAUW's Legal Advocacy Fund, helping women contest gender discrimination in promotion and tenure decisions;

\$16,470 for leading college girls to attend a student leadership conference, and \$13,127 for the cost of local girls' programs described in the next several paragraphs. Credit for the success of recent sales goes to the leadership of Elizabeth Clark Hessel; countless volunteer hours by our members and by middle, high school and college students; member donations; and hosting of the sale by Asbury Methodist Village.
