

Presidents Message

April has been an important month for equity as the Maryland legislature passed a suite of bills that support women and families. May will also be important to AAUW branch members.

The Maryland legislature ended their 2023 session on April 10. Roxann King, Maryland Co-VP for Public Policy provided this summary of legislation that AAUW Maryland members and branches support. These bills have passed and been sent to the Governor for his signature.

- The bill that makes the constitutional right to reproductive liberty a ballot item on the next Maryland general election.
- The bill to make reproductive healthcare available to students at public colleges and universities.
- The bill that repeals marriage as a defense for sexual crimes.
- The bill that holds the new Maryland Gun Control Center responsible for tracking guns surrendered due to final protective orders.

 The bill that absolves trafficked youth from non-violent crimes committed while being trafficked.



- The Collaborative Care Model bill, which expands the very successful model of providing mental health and addiction care management through a primary care physician.
- The Reproductive Health Protection Act, which would protect both patients and providers from out-of-state lawsuits and inquiries.

The Task Force to Study Emergency Room Wait Times passed the House 126-0 but failed to make it through the Senate. Two other bills supported by Maryland AAUW, the Climate Crisis and Environmental Justice Act and the Endof-Life Options Bill made no progress this session. Both will probably be reconsidered again in 2024. Many bills require several years to educate legislators about their importance and gain sponsors and supporters.
