# **Presidents Message**


Summer is almost here and many of you may be busy with graduation celebrations, family and friends. School (vacation) and news about ten percent tax increases for Montgomery County homeowners to support increased funding for education are on my mind so this seems like a good time to dig into the details. What are members who are committed to education and educational equity getting for their money?

The proposed county operating budget for Fiscal Year 2024 is \$6.833 billion, an increase from the current year's budget of \$6.3 billion. The 2024 budget allots \$3.2 billion to Montgomery County Public Schools, the amount requested by the school board. Montgomery College is allocated \$345.2 million. The county would spend \$12,744 per student and total spending per student would be \$19,554, the highest of all Maryland school districts, but lower than the District of Columbia and several other northeastern states.

School Board President, Karla Silvestre cited pandemic-related recovery efforts, the student mental health crisis, increased inflation, and competitive staff salaries as reasons why

the increased funds are needed.
Low post-pandemic math grades are a concern. Recent data from the state shows that middle school math proficiency within MCPS dropped from 42.5% before the pandemic to just over 23% in 2022, with success rates sinking further for students from underrepresented communities.

The driver for raising teacher salaries is the Blueprint for Maryland's Future—a long-term state-mandated plan to improve education—requires all school districts in the state to raise their minimum teacher salary to \$60,000 by 2026. Currently, the minimum starting salary for a teacher in MCPS is \$54,038. Given the cost of living in Montgomery County, make it feasible for a new Montgomery County teacher to live in Montgomery County.

### AAUW NATIONAL ELECTION RESULTS

The AAUW National Election voting closed on May 15, and we have the results.

- Kimberly S. Adams, Edwina Frances Martin, Jenna Kirkpatrick Howard, and Mary Zupanc have been elected to serve on the AAUW National Board of Directors.
- The bylaws revision was approved by 95.1% of voters.
- The Public Policy Priority revision was approved by 96.3% of voters.

# Student Scholarships - Can you help?

For years our Branch has funded local college scholarships for women students through book sales. Our branch was not able to hold it's big annual Book Sale this year due to Covid, but the student scholarship needs are higher than ever. Last year we were able to help five students (one at the Universities at Shady Grove and four at Montgomery College) with scholarships after we asked for donations from members to augment the smaller amount of funds we had raised through direct book sales. Letters of appreciation from two students, Marie-Louise Camara and Maya Kotek, are included in this newsletter. Other student letters were published earlier this year. They include a diverse set of women.

You can see that these are bright female students preparing for careers where women have been under-represented. They are the role models of the future for the younger generation. Our prior scholarship recipients have overcome significant obstacles working toward their dream of becoming engineers, architects, medical doctors, scientists, and business owners.

To continue to support scholarships for these types of bright young women, we are asking members to consider making a donation for the scholarship fund. The scholarship donations collected from members will be
