## **Presidents Message**

Fall brings cooler weather, colorful leaves and increased interest and action on legislation at the state and national level. MLAW, Maryland Legislative Agenda for Women and the AAUW Lobby Corps have open invitations for you to get involved. Before I talk about these two great programs that the Gaithersburg branch supports, I have a little interesting news on equity for women.

U.S. News and World Report magazine has ranked Maryland as the number 1 best state for gender equality. Maryland scored best in the nation for education, reflecting lower gender disparities in 8th grade math and reading scores and public college graduation rates. The review noted that a major driver for this success may be that Maryland has prioritized K-12 education under both the most recent Republican and Democrat governors, when other states have scaled back funding. The state also ranks highest in having a high proportion of women in elected office and managerial positions. In spite of the top score over two of the five categories, Maryland women ranked in 7th place in the economy category, which included earnings and labor force participation. Maine, Rhode Island, Vermont, and Illinois fill out the top five states for gender equality.

Members of MLAW, the Maryland Legislative Agenda for Women will meet on November 4 to hear presentations on about a dozen bills dealing with women's and family issues that are expected to be introduced in the Maryland General Assembly in the 2024 session. MLAW members, including AAUW Maryland and many AAUW members, will vote to select 6 to 8 of the bills for support, which includes in-person testimony and visits as well as email communication with legislators. Everyone in the Gaithersburg branch will be invited to vote for AAUW Maryland's preferences. All the MLAW-supported bills passed the 2023 General Assembly and became law, including legislation authorizing a November ballot measure to enshrine fundamental right to reproductive freedom in the Maryland Constitution. MLAW-supported bills also increased access and funding for early childhood development scholarships and repealed marriage as a defense of spousal rape. The announcement and registration for the MLAW fall conference is elsewhere in the newsletter.

AAUW Lobby Corps is a decades-old monthly gathering of AAUW members from branches located close to Washington, DC, and the US Congress. Each month that Congress is in session AAUW policy staff provide a briefing on legislation important to women and girls as well as guidance on how to effectively discuss the legislation with Senators or Representatives that are important to the legislation. Lobby Corps restarted this fall after a lengthy Covid-driven absence. In spite of the apparent lack of congressional activity reported in the news, hundreds of members of Congress are working to develop legislation to fund government agencies and programs important to citizens. The September 21 Lobby Corps Day briefed Senator Appropriation committee members on the importance of FY24 Labor-HHS-Education funding which invests in programs that increase access to higher education, including Pell Grants and Federal Work Study Programs. # MARYLAND LEGISLATIVE AGENDA FOR WOMEN – FALL CONFERENCE



MLAW's Annual Fall Conference, Eyes on the Prize: When Women Vote, We All Win, on November 4, is where we hear from legislators and advocates on upcoming bills in the Maryland General Assembly. This year it will be held from 9am to 1 pm at the University of Maryland, Baltimore County (UMBC) in the Engineering Arts Building. The location may not be as close as past meetings, but UMBC is only a 40-minute drive from Gaithersburg.

The Conference will provide information and strategies to activate and energize participants

to successfully advocate for legislation impacting women and families during the 2024 Maryland General Assembly Session. Advocates and legislators will be presenting 2024 legislative proposals.

2023 MLAW legislative-proposal advocacy contributed to passage of bills bringing reproductive freedom constitutional amendment to a vote in November, repealing the spousal defense for sex crimes against one's spouse, and prevents criminalizing of child victims of sex trafficking for acts committed as a result of their trafficking.
