AAUW Fights for Equity in Education

With the current administration working to dismantle the U.S. Department of Education, AAUW has posted a statement condemning this proposed action. You can find the statement under Press Releases on the website. The statement reads:

"The American Association of University Women (AAUW) unequivocally condemns President Trump's executive order "Improving Education Outcomes by Empowering Parents, States, and Communities" dismantling the U.S. Department of Education.

"This reckless and shortsighted action threatens to gut vital protections that ensure equal access to higher education and will have devastating consequences for students — especially women, students of color, and those from lowincome backgrounds — who rely on federal oversight for their right to an equitable education," said Gloria L. Blackwell, CEO of AAUW. Eliminating the Department of Education would decimate federal civil rights enforcement, slash protections against gender-based discrimination, and roll back decades of progress toward making higher education accessible and affordable. This decision is not about streamlining government; it is about stripping students of their rights and futures."

We can act by contacting our Congressional representatives and urging them to speak out against this move to strip students and educators of their rights and support. AAUW National has also established a fund to elevate critical higher education issues impacting women, mobilize advocates and provide resource to students and staff. \$2.00 AAUW DUES INCREASE FOR 2025 RENEWALS AND MEMBERS JOINING AFTER APRIL 1, 2025

Starting April 1, 2025, individual member dues in AAUW-US will be \$74. AAUW-Maryland dues will remain \$10, and AAUW Gaithersburg Branch dues will remain \$18. Thus, membership dues will total \$102.

The AAUW National Board provided this explanation for the increase: Member dues are an important funding source for AAUW. While costs for member support increase annually, member dues have not kept pace. The Board's decision to increase dues by \$2 allows AAUW dues to keep up with inflation and continue supporting the important work of AAUW.

Your member dues help fund our work such as:

Education & Advocacy: Member dues help support AAUW's public policy and member advocacy programs, which are now vitally im-

portant to defending higher education and rights for women on campus

Member Trainings: Our regular virtual member gatherings and training programs provide education and engagement on several relevant topics

Member Engagement: We organize member-led groups and committees like Archives Corps, Lobby Corps, and national committees, and coordinate AAUW's member advocacy through 2-Minute Activist

Real-Time Support: Connect Team provides daily assistance to members
