AAUW HERSTORY WILL MEET SATURDAY, OCTOBER 11 AT 2:00 PM IN CONLEY HALL, ASBURY

The Herstory meeting Saturday, Oct. 11, at 2 pm will be different from the usual in two respects: (1) It will take place in Conley Hall of Asbury Methodist Village, located on the lower level of the Trott Building (Bldg. 401). After entering the Asbury campus at 301 Odendhal Ave. Gaithersburg, turn right at the stop sign just past the gatehouse. At the next stop sign, turn left into the Trott Building's parking lot. Inside the building, proceed straight ahead, take a left in the first hall to the elevator; go to the lower level and Conley Hall will be in front of you.

(2) Moreover, the format this time will be different from the usual Herstory meeting. Lynn Neff, Ph.D. will present and interview our Herstory subject woman who will do much of her own talking. Hint: her writings covered what her readers wanted to know; others considered some of her subject matter inappropriate.

We will not be awarding a prize since the woman you will meet is expected to be physically present, and some of those attending will recognize her.
